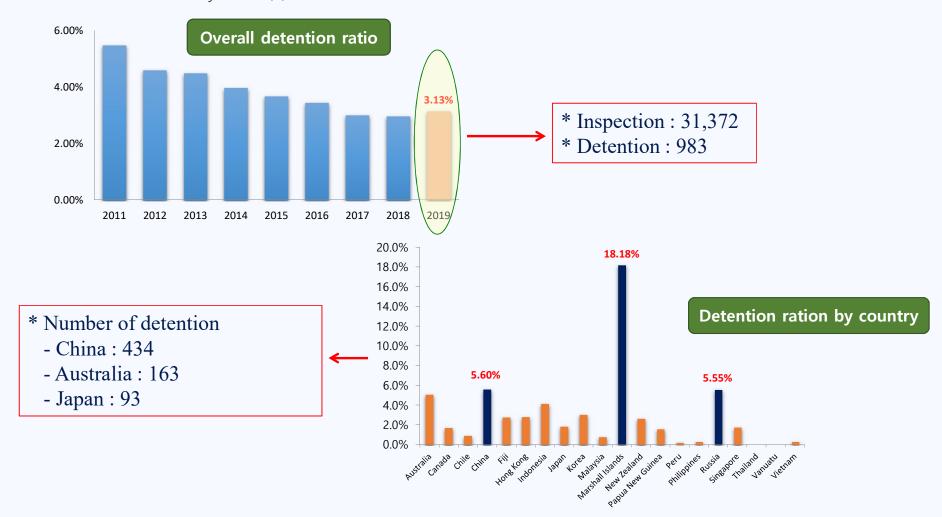

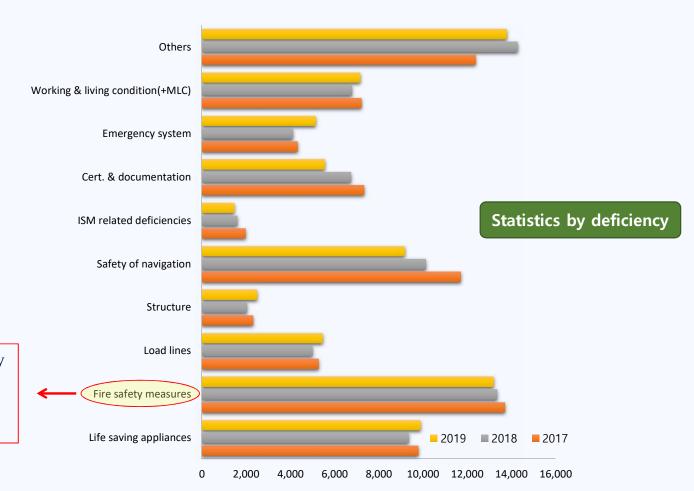

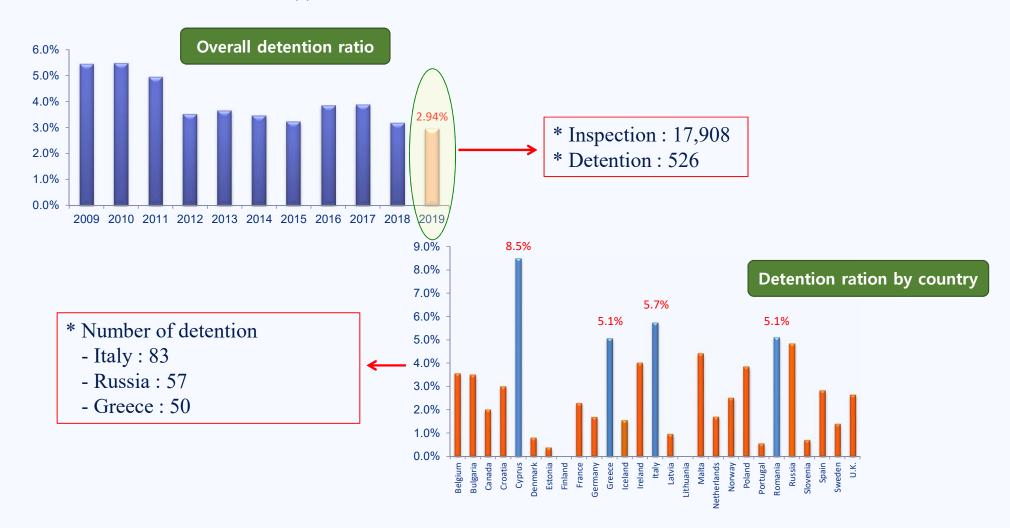

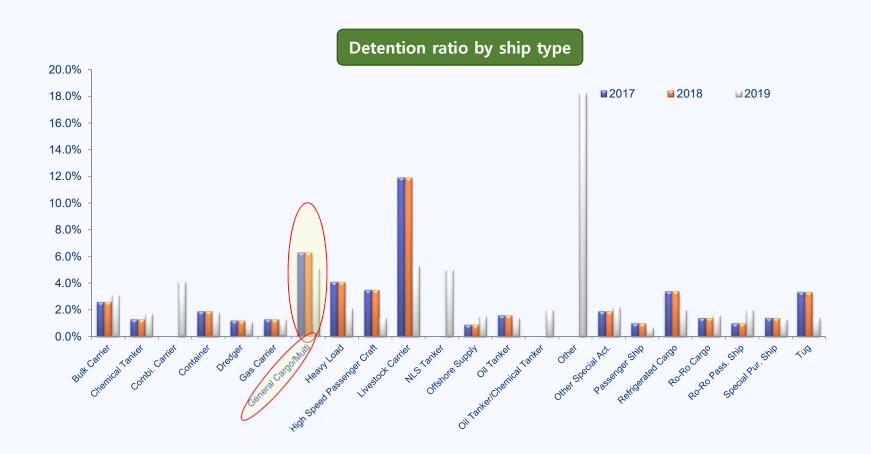

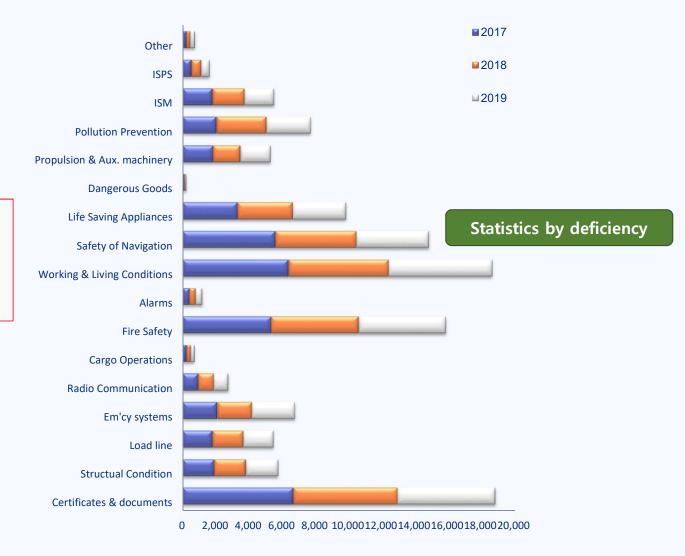

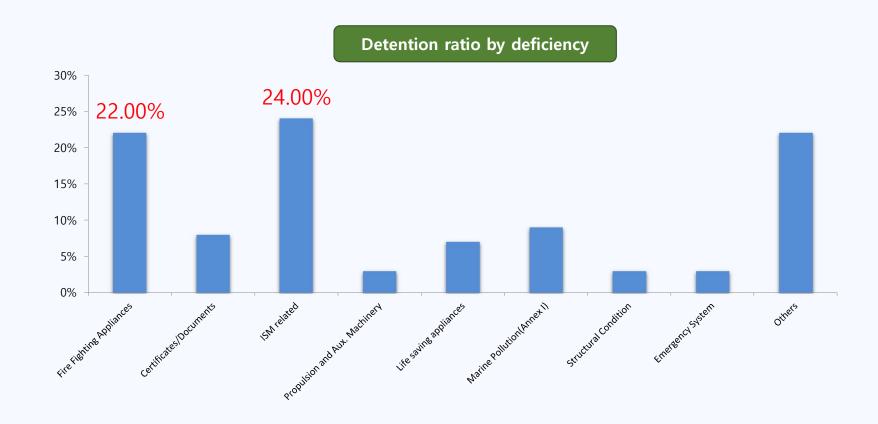

PART B. Recent noticeable deficiency – MLC





Deficiency

Boarding beyond the contract duration on SEA

Extended contract without agreement between company and crew

Extended contract without flag approval

Continuous boarding although there was a port where crew could disembark by terminating a contract **Country to watch out**

Australia, Korea, Japan, countries in Europe





PART C. PSC countermeasures

Before entering a port

- Actual inspections by checklists
- Proper and correct records
- E/R cleanliness
- Reporting critical deficiencies to a port authority according to SOLAS Chapter I/Reg.11(c)

PSC countermeasures

Just after berthing

- Thorough gangway watch
- One more check on E/R cleanliness

At the time of PSCO boarding

- Master and seniors(if possible) should stay on board.
- Amicable attitude to PSCO
- Immediate actions against identified deficiencies
- Request for a help to the KR HQ or a branch office

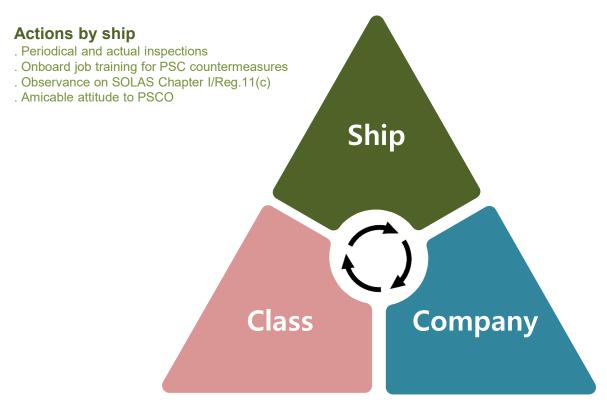
Benefit from preventing PSC detention

- PSC performance of a company to be enhanced
 - Reputation of a company to be enhanced
 - Unnecessary cost to be prevneted





PART C. PSC countermeasures



Role of class

- . Thorough surveys and audits
- . Timely provision of PSC information
- . Enhancement of relationship with port authorities

Supportive policy by company

- . Proper support for ship maintenance
- . Change of perception on PSC detention
- . Provision of continuous training for crew
